HF 2109	A bill for an act relating to vapor products and alternative nicotine products, and providing penalties. Effective 7-1-14.	Regulation of E-Cigarettes by keeping them out of the hands of minors.
HF 2130	A bill for an act relating to matters under the purview of the banking division of the department of commerce. Effective 7-1-14.	
HF 2131	A bill for an act modifying provisions applicable to the recording of a mortgage or deed of trust executed by a transmitting utility. Effective 7-1-14.

The Miller Trust allows for qualifying individuals to pay for Medicaid coverage for nursing home care that are not eligible for Medicaid coverage.

HF 2172	A bill for an act providing for the use of an electronic filing and notice system by the public employment relations board. Effective 7-1-14.
