Amendments

H-8457 by Rants (R) – States that any estimate of the revenue estimating conference at a later date exceeds the estimate of the general fund prior to December 15, the amount equal to such excess will be transferred from the general fund to the property tax equity and relief fund.

H-8412 by Tymeson (R) – Creates a new subsection in Code that restricts future use of Physical Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL). Only allows for PPEL approved prior to July 1, 2009.

H-8413 by Tymeson (R) – Creates a new paragraph regarding the Public Educational and Recreational Levy (PERL). Does not allow for any new uses of PERL after July 1, 2009.

H-8363 by Mascher (D) – Allows Johnson and Linn counties to keep their SILO for 10 years instead of the 5 years that was passed. There will be less money in the pool in 2014 if this occurs.

H-8450 by Paulsen and Struyk (R) – Only allows for the election ballot to let a voter approve the revenue purpose statement or to approve moneys for property tax relief.

H-8362 by Mascher (D) – Increases the threshold for the certificate of need to 250 students in a districts high school and 400 total district enrollment. Current law for certificate of need is 100 students in high school for the district and 250 students total per school district.

H-8364 by Mascher (D) – Requires a certificate of need if a school district exceeds their spending authority for two years in a row.

H-8380 by T. Taylor and D. Taylor (D) – A school district, if they were to have a public improvement construction project of \$300,000 or more, would have to pay the prevailing wage to workers at the construction site. The Labor Commissioner will determine annually and publish the prevailing wage rates by locality for each craft, classification, or type of worker needed to perform work on public improvements. The rates would be for one year, and would published on the website.

In performing duties to enforce the bill, the commissioner is allowed to make inquiries on complaints, to sue, to investigate or ascertain the wages, enter and inspect contractor place of business for specified purposes, copy records as necessary, questions workers, administer oaths, require full and correct statements, require contract to file records, withhold funds to contractor for failure to comply with requests, or contract with a public accountant.

H-8410 by T. Taylor and D. Taylor (D) – Corrective amendment to H-8380.
