AMENDMENT SUMMARY

H-8452 by Alons (R-Sioux)

- Creates a new crime of aiding and abetting identity theft to assist an unauthorized alien to obtain employment
- A person that aids and abets identify theft under this section commits the offense of identity theft under § 715A.8
- Under §715A.8, if the value of the credit, property, or service is more than \$1,000, it is a class D felony punishable by up to 5 years in prison and a fine of \$750 to \$7,500. If the value of the credit, property, or service is less than \$1,000, it is an aggravated misdemeanor punishable by up to 2 years in prison and a fine of \$500 to \$5,000

H-8453 by Olson (R-Clinton)

- Creates an aggravated misdemeanor for making a driver's license or nonoperator's identification card or any other form or document used to establish identity to assist an unauthorized alien to obtain employment
- Creates an aggravated misdemeanor for obtaining, possessing, or having driver's license or nonoperator's identification card forms or any other form or document used to establish a person's identity in order to assist an unauthorized alien to obtain employment
- Creates an aggravated misdemeanor for obtaining, possessing or having a driver's license or nonoperator's identification card or any other form or document used to establish a person's identity that has been made by a person with no authority or right to make the license, form or card to assist an unauthorized alien to obtain employment
- Creates an aggravated misdemeanor to use a false or fictitious name in any application for a driver's license or nonoperator's identification card, to knowingly make false statements, to knowingly conceal a material fact, or to commit any other fraud to assist an unauthorized alien to obtain employment

H-8454 by Paulson (R-Linn)

- Prohibits the DOT from issuing a nonoperator's identification card to an "unauthorized alien"
- Defines an "unauthorized alien" as "a person who is not a citizen or legal resident and who has not been lawfully admitted to the United States pursuant to federal law."
- Iowa DOT Rules already prevent an "unauthorized alien," as defined by this amendment, from receiving a driver's license or nonoperator's identification card, but this amendment would codify this prohibition

H-8455 by Pettengill (R-Benton)

- Creates a new section in the code on the protection of personal information
- Defines personal information as an individual's first name or first initial and last name in combination with unique identifiers such as social security number, driver's license number, or unique biometric data
- Requires the state government to destroy public records that contain personal information that are no longer required to be retained
- Creates a civil penalty for any government body or third party that violates this section of up to \$100 per record affected with a total penalty of up to \$50,000k

H-8456 by Pettengill (R-Benton)

- Requires the DOT to remove false identity information from the DOT's records
