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# Infrastructure Appropriations SF 2324

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### Summary

#### **Amendment H-8274 by Committee on Appropriations**

The House Amendment spends \$5 million less in RIIF and \$19 million less from the State Bond Repayment Fund (SBRF) than the Senate Version and makes the following changes:

- Reduces Major Maintenance Appropriation by \$5.8 million.
- Changes the allocations of \$250,000 carve out from Major Maintenance and move it to the \$9.9 million Capitol Dome appropriation in the State Bond Repayment Fund.
- Gives Health and Safety issues at Iowa law enforcement academy facilities in Iowa.
- Eliminates the \$450,000 carve out from the Water Quality appropriation to the ISU nutrient reduction strategy.
- Eliminates the \$250,000 appropriation for the USS Iowa.
- Eliminates the \$485,000 appropriation for the Homestead Facility that treats persons with Autism.
- Lowers the population from 35,000 to 28,000 for eligible YMCA's to get the appropriation.
- Eliminates the \$6.7 million appropriation for the Polk County Courthouse.
- Eliminates the \$250,000 appropriation for rural court house security grants.
- Eliminates the \$1.5 million appropriation for Waters Trails and Low Head Dams
- Eliminates the \$1.75 million appropriation for the Iowa Parks Foundation.
- Reduces the appropriation for the ISU Bio Sciences Building by \$4 million for FY 17 and increases it by \$4 million for FY 18.
- Moves the \$15.9 million appropriation for the UNI Schindler Building to RIIF. (The Senate funds it through the SBRF).
- Reduces the Recreational Trails appropriation by \$900,000.
- Reduces the Public Transit Infrastructure grants by \$250,000.
- Reduces the appropriation for the Rail Road Revolving Loan Grant by \$500,000.
- Moves the Veterans Home appropriations to RIIF. The Senate appropriation comes from the SBRF.
- Eliminates the \$250,000 appropriation for the Korea Project at the Sullivan Brothers Museum.
- Eliminates the \$300,000 appropriation for a Congenital and Inherited Disorders Registry.
- Eliminates the \$75,000 appropriation for an Iowa Prescription Drug Safety Net.
- Eliminates the \$250,000 appropriation for the final exhibit at the Gold Star Museum.
- Reduces the appropriation for the Voter Registration System by \$250,000.
- Moves the \$250,000 carve for lights on the Capitol, from major maintenance to the \$9.9 million Capitol Dome appropriation under the SBRF.
- Eliminates that \$606,125 appropriation for the Handicapped Housing Grant.

- Eliminates reversion language for a grant for Polk County emergency youth shelter that allows to be reimbursed from infrastructure appropriations from the prior fiscal year.
- Eliminates the Shallow Lakes language in the Senate Bill.
- Eliminates the salary restriction of RIF money on restricted employees in FY 17.
- Eliminates the ability of the Executive Council to purchase the Elim Christian Church on the Capitol Complex.
- Extends a TRF appropriation from the 2011 Legislative Session for Medicaid technology upgrades, allows unused funds to be appropriated through the end of FY 2020.

**Amendment H-8279 by Huseman**

- Eliminates the requirement that DAS work off the major maintenance priority list for the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter beginning July 1, 2015 and June 30, 2016.
